#### **Everyone's invited**

The expression 'to break bread together' carries several powerful meanings. It can be a symbol of acceptance and friendship, a gesture of peace and reconciliation, and, for Christians, the sacrament of Holy Communion, which unites us with Christ and with one another.

At the centre of all these meanings is a radical message: everyone is welcome. No one is excluded. All are invited to the table - to be strengthened, known, valued, and loved. CUF supports churches, faith groups, and communities to live out this message by building relationships, offering hospitality, overcoming differences, and loving their neighbours.



James wanted to "put something back" after receiving support to overcome addiction. He started Curry On The Street in Nelson, a Place of Welcome which now feeds and supports hundreds of people each year.

They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people.

## Prayer suggestions:

- Pray for James and the team at Curry on the Street in Nelson as they feed and support people facing adversity and vulnerability.
  Give thanks for the local partnerships they are establishing that are providing health and mental health services.
- CUF's sister charity, Near Neighbours, hosts regular Big Conversations that bring people together to talk about local issues and to build connections. Pray that these opportunities would be safe spaces that help build community across differences, and result in shared action on issues that matter.
- Tonbridge Road Methodist Church have set up an after school club for local young people. Thank God for the volunteers who provide a welcoming, safe and creative space each week.

# October

### Faith in the city

CUF CEO, Rt Revd Rob Wickham reflects on the 40th anniversary of the publication of the Archbishop's Commission report, Faith in the City:

"The report reshaped the Church's understanding of poverty, challenging both the Church and government on the structures that enabled poverty to flourish. Commissioners dared to listen to those who lived in poverty across the country, and these experiences shaped the recommendations, of which the creation of Church Urban Fund was a small part.

This report ignited imagination, channelled energy, stirred up deep-rooted passion and brought collaboration across the Church in parishes, dioceses and businesses to raise funds towards projects in urban priority areas. This task continues today, in an England that still experiences vast inequality, and where, in some places, over 50% of children grow up in poverty. The mission continues, and you are invited to be part of this mission."



## **Prayer suggestions:**

Dr Alan Billings was involved in the work on the Faith in the City report 40 years ago and shares his prayers:

They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.

Isaiah 61. 4

- Give thanks for the vision and commitment of Archbishop Robert Runcie and those who worked tirelessly over two years to visit the urban priority areas and compile the Faith in the City report. Give thanks for the many projects that were funded and the volunteers who supported them.
- Pray for those who continue to work in urban ministry. Pray that the original vision of Faith in the City may be rekindled in them and the wider church may support them as they seek to transform unjust structures and share God's compassion.
- The populations of urban areas are ethnically and religiously more diverse than 40 years ago and this can lead to people living parallel lives. Pray for those Christians who seek to engage with those of other faiths and cultures on a continuing basis. Pray for all those who work to bring communities together.

# November

#### Treasure in your community

Our work is based on the foundation of a faith that sees God at work in our communities, however beleaguered we feel, and however hard things might be. Our faith is that God is there with us, in all that is good. Our role is to find what God is doing and join in.

Looking for God at work among us, and seeking the gifts that God has already given to us in our communities but that we may not immediately see, are the principles of Asset Based Community Development (ABCD)<sup>1</sup>. It is to look for abundance and generosity and gifts among us, not to focus on needs and deficits. This is the treasure among us.
