# **Together Network**

The Just Finance Foundation have created the <u>Coronavirus Help Hub</u>, a signposting resource designed to help people navigate the current times.

JFF have also developed the <u>COVID</u> <u>Cash Course</u>, a pioneering new course which trains community leaders and organisations to deliver financial capability information remotely to individuals in their community.

Finally, through their Lifesavers programme, JFF are producing exciting

ways to deliver food from foodbanks to setting up online or phone based resources for those who are vulnerable or isolated.

As just one example, our venture in Plymouth, *Transforming Plymouth Together*, has been supporting a local church to run a weekly food hamper collection sharing food donated by Devon & Cornwall Food Action and Fare Share.

"Last week as it was Holy Week, we bought all the people receiving the hampers a little bag of eggs. In total it was just over 100 parents and children, about 30 families from a number of different schools in the areas around the church. The families worker who is coordinating it all has had some lovely, grateful texts from families saying thank you. It's been a brief (and social distancing respected) but lovely chance

for the church to see people and show support to those in need."



## Volunteering

Though there are restrictions to how we are able to help in light of the coronavirus, there are still so many ways that you can support those in your community.

This could include running errands for people who are having to isolate, and keeping in touch with neighbours, older relatives or members of your church.
