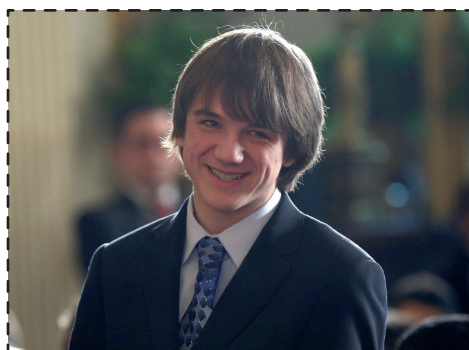

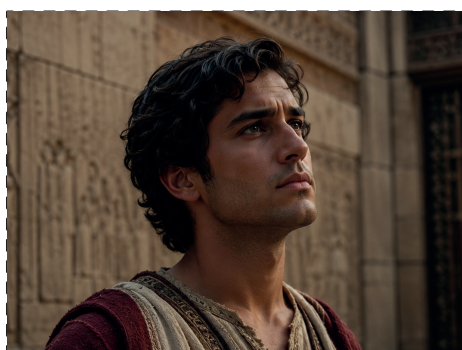

GROWING GOOD:

Youth

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This person started protesting about climate change when they were at school. They inspired youth and adult action around the world, by challenging world leaders to protect the planet. This person was born in Sweden, and is now a world-famous activist.

This person started speaking out about the rights of girls in Pakistan when they were a child. As a result, they were shot aged 15. They recovered, and went on to continue to campaign for educational rights, winning a global peace prize in 2014 aged 17.

This person started a campaign called Free Periods when they were 17, to make sure no girls in the UK have to miss out on schooltime just because they can't afford period products. They've published a book for other young activists called 'Make it Happen.'

These UK siblings started to campaign against single-use plastics when they were 10 and 12. They began by collecting plastic from beaches themselves, before launching 'Kids Against Plastic' to unite and educate others to fight plastic pollution.

This person was studying in a US school when their family lost a close friend to cancer. Following the loss, this person decided to use their skills in science to make a difference, eventually designing a new way to detect pancreatic cancer earlier than before.

When this person was 11, they learnt about the impact of deforestation on their local environment in Kenya. As a keen footballer, this person started a youth football project called 'Trees for Goals'. Two years later, 1,400 new trees had been planted.

This person decided to start fundraising for health charities aged 9, after seeing their little sister affected by health conditions. Through taking part in various challenge events, they raised more than £9,000 towards medical research.

This person was caught up in conflict when they were 17 and taken as a war prisoner. They refused to turn their back on their family ways and faith in God, even when they were thrown into a fire (which they miraculously survived). More than 2,000 years later, they still inspire people as an example of bravery and faith.
