Good News Story

Together Liverpool are supporting the operations of St George's Pantry, which is delivering emergency food each week to 40+ homes in Everton. Project Worker Naomi is also coordinating Feeding Liverpool, which is distributing food supplies for organisations working with vulnerable families.

The Smith family from Clubmoor Liverpool found themselves in a crisis as the husband and main bread-winner had lost his job in the hospitality sector and with two kids at home, household spending had significantly increased. An application for Universal Credit had gone in straight away but takes a number of weeks and in the meantime rent and debts still needed to be paid. Never having accessed a foodbank before, they contacted us and we were able to supply them with 3 days emergency food including fresh fruit and veg. We were also able to signpost them to the City Council's Citizen Support Scheme for further support.

Also a huge congratulations to Together Liverpool for their recent award from The National Lottery Fund of £40,400. The grant is part of the Lottery's initial emergency response to COVID-19 to help vulnerable people and communities overcome the immediate crisis and other support challenges brought about by the virus.



More Good News

Partner organisations from the Together Network continue to do great work supporting their local communities.

Together for Change, in Coventry, have developed their Good Neighbours project to work in partnership with HOPE Coventry and the Coventry Foodbank RDC to support the isolated elderly with food and friendship support. They're coordinating telephone calls and letters, food parcels deliveries, and a volunteer shopping and medicine collection service.

Transforming Lives Together have been able to secure Covid-19 funding from the Cheshire Community Foundations to pride emergency food to communities in the Cheshire area in partnerships with churches. One example of this is their work with New Brighton Baptist Church who have delivered food to vulnerable people in their local community, as can be seen in the photo above.



Covid Cash Course

COVID Cash Course is a flexibly delivered information and signposting course which aims to prevent the significant financial challenges posed by the Coronavirus from causing crisis in local communities. Developed by the Just Finance Foundation (with Transforming Communities Together and Capital Mass), the course provides accurate information and resources for churches, community leaders and organisations to help them respond to vast increase in finance related issues that have emerged over the past few months.

So far over 150 community leaders and organisations have already attended 'train-the-trainer' sessions, with the course now being rolled out to financially precarious groups across the country.

Most importantly, the COVID Cash Course is benefiting those who have been thrown into financial shock due to the Coronavirus. After attending a session, 96% of the course attendees say they have a clear plan and budget for the next few months.
