The Volunteering Gap

October 2012



Church Urban Fund commissioned Ipsos MORI to conduct a piece of research about volunteering in England.

The research shows that there is a 'volunteering gap' in England, as only a third of people give up their time to volunteer for any kind of project.

A great deal of regional variation is seen in the kind of volunteering people do: volunteers in the north are more likely to volunteer to help socially disadvantaged people, than volunteers living in the South or in London.

1. Only a third (33%) of people aged 15+ in England give up their time to volunteer for any kind of project.

3. Volunteers living in the north of England volunteer to help the socially disadvantaged much more (19% of all volunteers) than those living in the South (12% of volunteers) or London (4% of volunteers).

11% of volunteers in the North said that they help people who are homeless or in poor housing conditions, compared to 2% in the South and 4% in London.

8% of Northern volunteers help people with drug, alcohol or substance abuse problems versus 4% in the South and London.

Only 2% of volunteers based in London support people with debt or low incomes.

Volunteers living the midlands and the south are more likely to help people with a disability or serious illness than volunteers in the north or London.
